




## Meet King St:

#### Mitchell Pierce, Lead Educator at Guardian Childcare

Guardian Childcare and Education offers exceptional programs for children aged six weeks to six years, fostering learning and discovery through play. We are delighted to have this expansive learning centre right here in the heart of Bowen Hills at King St.

Recently, we had the pleasure of speaking with lead educator Mitchell Pierce about the centre and his experiences on King St.



What sets Guardian apart from other childcare centres is their philosophy to promote children's learning. We have a strong focus on learning through play, allowing the children to build strong connections with both educators and their peers as they develop through their social interactions. Working with children means engaging in creative and fun activities. This can range from art-based learning experiences to imaginative play allowing the children to explore their creativity and curiosity. Learning through play helps build resilience, social interaction/connection, problem-solving skills, and creative ability, all while developing large muscle groups that help them become big movers.

#### What's your favourite thing about working with kids?

Children have a unique way of bringing joy and laughter into any situation. Their innocence, humour, and enthusiasm can be incredibly uplifting. They can put a smile on my face every day just by the things they do and say. There is no hiding from the fact that the role can be exhausting and draining; it can push you to your limits, and this has allowed me to have so much personal growth. It challenges you to adapt to different situations and meet the diverse needs of each child. I continue to learn so much from these children every day and love every single one of them. It is all about being patient and empathetic in their learning journey while giving them the tools to display their natural creative abilities.





#### What's your favourite part about coming to work each day?

My favourite part about coming in each day is super simple but something that brings me so much joy and it is interacting with the children. The bonds I have formed with the children in the centre have been so strong and meaningful. The trust and affection that has been developed is what inspires me to come in every day and is so heartwarming. What has set this job apart from any of my other previous employment is that no two days are the same in childcare. The dynamic nature of working with children means there's always something new and different happening, which keeps the job exciting and engaging.

#### What has been your biggest achievement at Guardian so far?

What I am most proud of is seeing children that were in my kindergarten group last year move into their schooling lives; having them come back and see me in their school uniforms was amazing to see and, hopefully, I played a positive role for them to take these steps in their schooling journey. This is the most fulfilling part of the role of an educator-seeing children grow and develop over time. Even now moving into the Nursery room, whether it's taking their first steps or learning new skills, being a part of these milestones is immensely gratifying. Knowing that you are helping lay the foundation for a child's future success is a powerful motivator.

#### Where is your favourite spot on King St?

I am a sucker for a pastry and good coffee, so there's no better place to go than Kuhl-Cher. Very personable and kind staff who make beautiful coffee that helps get my day started. Go and check them out!

## EXHIBITION QUARTER

#### **CONSTRUCTION UPDATES:**

We're seeing some real action on the Exhibition Quarter build, and it's climbing to impressive heights! It's been non-stop on site, with the team working hard and ticking off milestone after milestone. The lift and stair cores have shot up to levels 13 and 14, the level 8 tower slabs have been poured, and the team is already starting on the level 9 formwork. Down closer to ground level, the all-important party walls are going up on levels 1 and 2, which means these awesome new apartments are taking shape. Here are a few other highlights from the last few months:

- The level 4 car park slabs are being poured as we speak!
- The formwork has been stripped from levels 3 and 4, and the team has set their sights on doing the same for level 5.
- Underslung services are currently being installed on levels 3, 4 and 5
- External facade finishes and balustrades have been installed on levels 1, 2 and 3, and the perimeter screens have moved to level 3 of the tower.







## Meet the team Izaac Jenkins and George Stokes



It's hard to miss King St's newest buildings, but why not meet the team behind the monuments? We caught up with Izaac Jenkins and George Stokes to talk about what they and the team have been up to..

What are your roles on the team and how long have you been on this project?

George and I are the Contract Administrators on the project and we have both been involved in this project since Hutchies was awarded the contract for construction in late 2022. Our primary responsibility is to work with local subcontractors and suppliers to create a project team responsible for the delivery of the project. As Contract Administrators, we are responsible for a lot of the early work, so it is satisfying seeing the project progress each day.

What's your favourite part about coming to work each day?

Working on construction projects presents a lot of challenges, George and I both enjoy working as a team with the rest of our management crew to overcome these challenges.

What's your go-to lunch order on King St?

We can collectively agree our favourite is a steak sandwich from the Jubilee Hotel, but are very much fans of Il Verde and Sushi & Nori.

Where is the team's favourite spot for an after-work drink?

The entire team enjoys some wings, drinks and footy at Winghaus.

What are the biggest differences that you've noticed between Exhibition Quarter and other projects you've worked on?

Exhibition Quarter is different in the sense that it has specific facilities and functionality designed for rental buildings, and as this is the first build-to-rent project we have worked on, it has been a pleasure to learn about the different style of design.

How do you think this development will influence future housing developments?

I think it's no secret that it is very hard to get a rental apartment in Brisbane, and according to recent studies rental vacancies are lower than 1%. EQ1 will offer 443 quality apartments that can help meet this demand. EQ1 also has fantastic common area amenities such as a yoga room, wellness area and podcast rooms that will be a benchmark for the industry.




#### Lendlease Deep Listening Day
